Streetcar vehicle testing

Streetcar workers will start running two streetcars simultaneously to meet FTA requirements beginning Tuesday, April 5. Metro riders can move to and from stops across Cincinnati, complimenting existing transit lines and encouraging multi-modal transportation as a commuting option.

As part of the exclusive partnership, Metro customers will begin seeing interior transit cards on buses advertising a unique code for a free ride on Uber for first-time users.

"Many of our customers have expressed their interest in using rideshare services like Uber in conjunction with their Metro trip to bridge the gap between service hours and locations," said Metro CEO& General Manager Dwight A. Metro detours for Cincinnati Reds Opening Day parade

The baseball season is upon us and you know what that means.... Cincinnati Reds Opening Day! Be sure to take Metro downtown Monday, April 4 for the opening day parade beginning at noon. MANY Metro routes will be on slight detours beginning at 9 a.m.

You should start to see the streetcars moving along the tracks of city streets for eight hours on that day.

Each of the five cars must have a specific amount of mileage as part of the preparation phase over the next five months. Four cars have been delivered to the Cincinnati Streetcar Maintenance and Operations Facility in OTR. The fifth and final car is scheduled to arrive in late-April. Metro Futures Task Force: Transit needs to change to meet regional needs

After six months of work, the Metro Futures Task Force presented its key learnings and recommendations to the Executive Committee of the Southwest Ohio Regional Transit Authority (SORTA) Board of Trustees in March.

Composed of 20 business and community leaders, the task force was convened in September 2015 to explore how Metro can best connect people to jobs, education, healthcare and more. The team heard from industry experts, held 12 community listening sessions, and conducted an on-line survey that generated more than 1,200 responses. Lean more here.
